President's Message by Mary Olson

This is actually our first print newsletter of 2021. With the loss of revenue from our bookstore and large book sales, we have been trying to conserve funds. Monthly email updates have continued. Email does have the advantage of incurring no expense and no lag time for printing and postal delivery. In addition, at a time when library activities are primarily virtual, an email can include a link which will take you right to the activity that interests you!

Email updates from Ventura Friends of the Library should arrive in your inbox right around the first of the month. If you are not receiving them, we may not have your correct email address. (Or, they may be going right into your spam folder) Please let us know if you are not receiving emails and would like to by emailing friends@venturafriendsofthelibrary.org.

It is not necessary to be a member to receive email updates -- anyone can sign up to our email list at our website. We actually maintain 2 separate lists -- one for members, and one designated for those who are "interested". Some email communications are sent only to the members list, but most, including the monthly updates, are sent to both lists.

Our Amazon book sales and local sales through our website have kept us going this year. We have some great volunteers who have continued working, in part from home, and, to a limited extent, at the warehouse with COVID prevention restrictions.

Our Fund Development Committee has been very active meeting on Zoom and researching grants to fund library activities. Their efforts have borne fruit with a grant from Aera Energy to help fund the BrainFuse tutoring resource. See BrainFuse on page 5.

We are preparing for a book sale on April 17. See page 3. Our expectation is that the procedures we put in place for the October book sale will be followed. În terms of the COVID 19 situation, there is quite a bit of uncertainty. If things improve greatly and the library has opened up to some extent, that could alter how the sale will be conducted. So, once again, watch your email for current information!

Most recently, Ms. Knight was City Librarian for the Ventura County Library's East Region overseeing the Ray D. Prueter Library, the Piru Library, the Fillmore Library, and the Oak Park Library. She began as Senior City Librarian for the Ventura Region on March 22, 2021.

Our Annual Membership Meeting was conducted by Zoom on Sunday, October 25 2020

The adaptations we had made in order to function within the restrictions imposed due to the pandemic were discussed. These included the reopening of our Amazon account, the creation of our online store for local sales in August and establishing a protocol for a limited number of volunteers to return to sorting books in the warehouse. The Book Sales Committee identified a window of opportunity for holding an outdoor book sale and a sale was held on October 24th observing COVID 19 prevention protocols.

The board resumed monthly meetings by Zoom and a Book Sales Committee and Fund Development Committee also conducted meetings by Zoom throughout the year.

All the current officers expressed willingness to serve again for another year, no other nominations were offered, and the officers were re-elected for 2021.



Ventura Friends of the Library would like to thank everyone for a very successful first six months with our online bookstore. Customer response has been very positive, and sales have been averaging \$500 a month. This was a great help in moving inventory at a time when large book sales were almost non-existent, and our library stores have been closed. The online bookstore has a wide variety of reading materials for everyone, and some great gift ideas. We also sell puzzles, DVDs, and audio books. It is a convenient way to get quality books at bargain prices, avoid shipping costs, and help your Ventura Libraries. We anticipate that the online store will remain even after the Pandemic has moved on.

Treasurer's 2020 Recap – Kathy Thomson

Enough has been said about covid. Of course, 2020 was a struggle, but never underestimate a team of impassioned library supporters. It was inspirational to watch how Friends' volunteers switched gears from bookstore and book sales to an increased online sales presence, both locally and nationally, as well as grant writing to procure funds provided for nonprofits affected by the covid lockdowns.

Despite the closure of the libraries and the Foster Library bookstore and Hill Road Library Friends' book nook, the Ventura Friends of the Library were still able to provide \$54,000 in 2020 to the County Library System for use in Ventura's libraries. Of that \$54,000, the following contributed to the grand total; book sales - \$21,247, membership dues - \$9,635, donations - \$4,848, Grants (PPP and VC/VCCF covid grants) - \$6,000, Art sales (Henry and Susan Stoutz estate gift) - \$610, and the annual distribution from the VCCF Friends Endowment Fund- \$19,843 and Bank Family Fund - \$3,160. A distribution from annual income of \$6,000 was also made to the Friends Capital Improvement Fund (library construction and expansion) held at VCCF (Ventura County Community Foundation).

In the coming year I will be transitioning out of the Treasurer position and training my replacement as I open a new chapter in Tucson, AZ. I know Ventura's libraries will remain in good hands with strong administrators, knowledgeable and enthusiastic librarians and staff and a dedicated, hardworking Friends group.

Serving on the board of Ventura Friends of the Library for the past 11 years as President and then as Treasurer of Ventura Friends of the Library has been a rewarding and productive experience. We accomplished many goals including contributing over \$200,000 to the opening of the state-of-the-art Hill Road Library. We also increased our outreach, engagement, and visibility in the community. Some of my most rewarding experiences were engaging with members of the community and presenting to elected officials at city council meetings and Board of Supervisors meetings as well as Ventura Library Commission and community council meetings to inspire them to become as impassioned as I was about the need for supporting libraries in their budgets and promoting the great resource of public libraries to the community.

As a wise past board member of the Friends once said, "It's not just about the books". And please spread the word, the libraries can always use another 'Friend'.



BrainFuse is one of the online resources the library introduced last year in response to the pandemic. BrainFuse offers on demand eLearning for all ages and levels. BrainFuse is available through the vencolibrary.org website from any computer with internet connection seven days a week from 1 pm to 10 pm.

Ventura Friends of the Library has announced an initial gift of \$7,000 from Aera Energy LLC to kick off its funding campaign for Ventura County Libraries online tutoring program BrainFuse.

"it is no secret that our students are struggling during this pandemic and we need to do what we can to support continued learning," explains Michele Newell, public affairs representative for Aera Energy. BrainFuse is a free program families can use to keep students on track and provide them the extra help they may need. We are partnering with Ventura Friends of the Library because Aera has always been a steadfast supporter of education and programs that help our children be their absolute best. They are our future and we are keenly invested in the future of our community."

Nancy Schram, Ventura County Library Director, added that "the generous donation of Aera has made it possible for the Library to support students throughout the County with free access to live online homework tutoring in both English and Spanish with their library card. From April 2020 to February 2021 there were almost 2000 uses of this resource. Thank you to Aera Energy for making this possible and supporting children in our community."

SPRING READING CHALLENGE

Beginning in April, Ventura County Library is offering a Spring Reading Challenge using a reading program creation tool called Beanstack. Read books, play games, and win prizes!

Registration is required at vencolibrary.beanstack.org
Kids are encouraged to read books and log reading minutes. After reading 500 minutes, readers may collect one free book to add to their home libraries.

Adults in this challenge may submit an entry everytime they read a book, be they traditional books, audiobooks, or eBooks. You can log up to 100 titles throughout the duration of the challenge, and each title is a chance to win a prize. A **Summer Reading Challenge** will also be offered.


