

BrainFuse is one of the online resources the library introduced last year in response to the pandemic. BrainFuse offers on demand eLearning for all ages and levels. BrainFuse is available through the vencolibrary.org website from any computer with internet connection seven days a week from 1 pm to 10 pm.

Beginning in April, Ventura County Library is offering a Spring Reading Challenge using a reading program creation tool called Beanstack. Read books, play games, and win prizes!

Kids are encouraged to read books and log reading minutes. After reading 500 minutes, readers may collect one free book to add to their home libraries.

Adults in this challenge may submit an entry everytime they read a book, be they traditional books, audiobooks, or eBooks. You can log up to 100 titles throughout the duration of the challenge, and each title is a chance to win a prize. A **Summer Reading Challenge** will also be offered.

Although the focus for the summer will not be on performers, librarians are actively looking into hosting some outdoor events as long as there aren't any restrictions for that by Summertime. Various grab and go activity kits will be provided along with book pickups. These kits have been a way to showcase the library collections, a way to engage with families as they are staying & schooling at home, and truly a fantastic way to stay connected with the communities the library serves.
