PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE by Mary Olson

This is actually our first print newsletter of 2022. After our Annual Membership Meeting last October, we had hopes that a return to something like normal was just around the corner.

After months of Zoom meetings, our Annual Membership Meeting was held in person in the Topping Room with a guest speaker. Betsy Chess had recently published her memoir, "Daughter of the Land", recounting her family's history in Ventura County agriculture. 20 Friends' members and 10 visitors came to hear Betsy's fascinating presentation. Our organization purchased 3 copies of the book, one of which was given to Ventura County Library and 2 were given to attendees as "door prizes". Books were autographed, the board for 2022 was elected and we adjourned to enjoy the coming holidays and expected to hold a book sale in January.

What actually followed was a series of unfortunate events! On the first of January, we received notice from Ventura County Library that library buildings would again close to the public for a three-week period, as a precautionary measure to slow the spread of COVID-19. The library returned to curbside pickup of library books, our plans for a book sale were put on hold, the bookstore in E.P. Foster was closed. We were permitted to have only one volunteer at a time enter the library to process donations (still being received curbside at E.P. Foster and Hill Road) and to fulfill orders from our online store. Volunteers hustled to add items to our online store for local sales and those sales as well as our sales on Amazon continued

That closure of the library buildings continued until February 16, at which time our bookstore in E.P. Foster library also reopened. Shortly thereafter, we had confirmed permission to hold a book sale at the Vons at Telegraph and Victoria on March 19. Although that left a short time frame to prepare, we decided to go ahead.

Joanne Fields organized an entry for Ventura Friends of the Library in the St. Patrick's Day Parade on March 12. Student volunteers walked along side the decorated car and passed out lollipops with bookmark-sized handouts promoting our book sale and bookstores to the spectators along the parade route. Other publicity for the book sale included the Friends' Email Update, flyers and handouts at the library branches and social media posts by Friends volunteers and Ventura County Library's social media. The book sale netted around \$1500 which was quite a good result under the circumstances.

Meanwhile, back at E.P. Foster Library – there had been a significant plumbing failure. A water leak in the second floor restroom impacted large areas of the second floor, the first floor and the Topping Room lobby. In addition to mold abatement and drying out the affected areas, the structural integrity of the walls and ceilings had to be examined. This caused a closure of E.P. Foster Library which lasted until Friday, March 25. Our bookstore in E.P. Foster reopened on Tuesday, March 29. During the remediation period, the books from our bookstore were all moved into the Topping Room as it was necessary to replace the carpet in the bookstore area. Fulfillment of orders to our online bookstore was delayed as we were unable to access our inventory in E.P. Foster. At present, all bookstore and online bookstore operations have been restored and we are looking forward to another book sale on July 16, and, maybe, a return to something like normal.



We are sorry to report that the Friends of the Library Book Discussion which met in the Topping Room on Saturday mornings is no longer functioning.

However, there is an FOL Book Group that discusses any or even all the books they read in the past month.

Sometimes members pass along books. This long term group is seeking new members. Right now meetings are on Zoom. In the past, meetings were held in a meeting room or at members' homes, rotating hosts. The group may or may not go back to in person meetings. 

The Ventura County Library has announced the selection for One County, One Book 2022. This year's title is **Taste Makers: Seven Immigrant Women Who Revolutionized Food in America** by Mayukh Sen!



Taste Makers explores America's modern culinary history through the lives of seven pathbreaking chefs and food writers. This group biography from an electric new voice in food writing honors seven extraordinary women, all immigrants, who left an indelible mark on the way Americans eat today. Taste Makers stretches from World War II to the present, with absorbing and deeply researched portraits of figures including Mexican-born Elena Zelayeta, a blind chef; Marcella Hazan, the deity of Italian cuisine; and Norma Shirley, a champion of Jamaican dishes."

This year's One County, One Book program is officially sponsored by the Ventura County Library Foundation. Copies of the book will be available to borrow from all Ventura County Library branches. Events will run through the month of October and conclude with a special engagement featuring Mayukh Sen on Saturday, November 12, 2022. Zip Books is back!

This is a grant program funded by the California State Library.

You must have a library card in good standing with the Ventura County Library. Books (print or audio) are delivered to you free and directly from Amazon. After three weeks, return the book to your library branch and hand it to staff please. Put the Amazon receipt or put a note inside the book to identify it as a Zipbook. Print books must be valued under \$50. Audio books and foreign language books can be valued up to \$75. Books should not be available at our library (no prepublication orders or brand new releases please)

After another temporary closure due to a plumbing problem in E.P. Foster, the bookstore reopened on March 29 with a bit of a refresh and new carpeting!

The Friends have received an unusual book donation – a collection of more than 700 volumes concerning the Civil War. These include documents from the Union and the Confederacy, memoirs of generals and published academic and popular histories. None of these will be on offer at the July book sale. We are in the process of researching the items in an effort to assure that they are appropriately offered for sale or donated to libraries or academic institutions. The Ventura County Library is participating in The California State Library's "Lunch at the Library" again this year during the Summer Reading Program. Avenue and Saticoy libraries are locations where free lunches are available for children and teens 18 years and under.

Librarians use this opportunity to introduce visitors to library resources and offer activities relating to nutrition, food waste and farm-to-table. STEAM kits are provided for kids to explore science, math and technology concepts. The library offers these meals in partnership with Ventura Unified School District through the USDA Summer Food Service Program and with the support of generous sponsors including Premier America Credit Union, Ventura Friends of the Library, and Ventura County Library Foundation.



Ventura County Library's summer reading program, **Read Beyond the Beaten Path**, is underway through August 14.

The whole family can register to log their reading at vencolibrary.beanstack.org.
Grab-and-go STEAM kits will be available at all library branches, a different one every other week throughout the summer.

This year Ventura County Library is giving away 13 Nintendo Switch Grand Prizes as well as smaller STEAM prizes throughout the summer. In addition, once a child has logged 500 minutes, they may visit their local branch to choose a free new book to add to their home libraries.



Annual Membership Meeting

on Sunday, October 24, 2021 in E.P. Foster Library Topping Room

We finally met in person again after 2 years of Zoom meetings. We even had a guest speaker, Betsy Blanchard Chess, join us for a dicussion and book signing of her memoir, **Daughter of the Land**. The book chronicles her family's colorful and consequential history in the agricultural industry on the Central Coast.

Her presentation was followed by a brief business meeting to receive the Treasurer's report, elect the Officers for 2022 and vote on a bylaw change.

The following additions (in **bold underscore italic**) to Article VIII, Section 2 of the Bylaws were adopted:

ARTICLE VIII – COMMITTEES Section 2. Standing Committees.

6) Fund Development. Encourage memorial gifts, endowments, bequests, and other projects which will enrich the resources of the library.

All members of the Fund Development Committee shall be members in good standing of the Association.

<u>The Fund Development Committee shall maintain</u> <u>minutes of their meetings and make those minutes</u> available to the Board of Directors.

Grant proposals developed by the Committee shall be submitted to the Executive Committee for approval before submission to the potential grantor.


