PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE by Mary Olson

This is our first edition of Ex Libris for 2023. As a recap of 2022, I am happy to report that we did see significant progress in getting back to normal.

Last Spring brought programming for adults back into the library and the Summer Reading Program returned in person for the kids. E.P. Foster and Hill Road offered a full program of STEAM activities with Maker Labs and Camps and even a Little Lab for kids aged 3 to 7 to explore science concepts through play. E.P. Foster, Hill Road and Preuter libraries collaborated to allow kids from all those areas to join in Lego Minecraft constructions. Avenue and Saticov libraries participated in the Lunch at the Library program over the summer, feeding bodies and minds by serving lunches and introducing visitors to library resources and activities relating to nutrition, food waste and gardening.

The Friends of the Library have been happy to support all these efforts. Our bookstore in E.P. Foster produced steady income all year and our honor shelves in Hill Road library have enjoyed heavy use. Our Amazon sales had a banner year yielding around \$1,000 each month. Our online sales have been augmented with sales of vintage books on eBay. And the online bookstore we initiated for local sales during the pandemic shutdown has continued in operation, reaching another group of customers. We were able to hold 3 sales at the Vons at Victoria and Telegraph (March, July and October) where we are able to reach casual buyers who might not otherwise be aware of our sales. All of these income avenues met or exceeded the goals set in our budget for this past year, thanks to a cadre of committed volunteers who continually work wonders.

Thanks to all these efforts, we were able to donate to the library \$4,000.00 for collections, \$4,000.00 for Summer programming, \$3,000.00 in support of Lunch at the Library, \$12,000.00 for Fall programming at E.P. Foster, Hill Road, Avenue and Saticov libraries and \$1,000.00 in support of the One County One Book program. Our end of the year donation of \$50,000, which includes income generated from endowment funds held at Ventura County Community Foundation, is generally used to add books to the libraries' collections.

Thanks to all of you for your support of the vital mission of libraries in our community.



Meet Rebecca Russell


Just over a month ago, Rebecca Russell stepped into the role of Senior City Librarian for the Ventura region of the Ventura County Libraries.

CA: Circulation Section Head – Librarian II at Volusia County Public Library in Florida; Director of Library & Learning Resources for El Camino College in Torrance, CA; Learning Resources Supervisor for Ventura College; Senior Content Technologist at Houghton Mifflin Harcourt School Publishers; and, School Librarian/Media Specialist for Orange County Public Schools. She holds a Master's Degree in Library and Information Science from Florida State University, and a Master's Degree in Interdisciplinary Studies from New York University.

In addition. Rebecca is also a transformational life coach trained by Martha Beck (The Way of Integrity: Finding the Path to Your True Self) and a Level 2 Active Dreaming Teacher and Dream Analyst trained by Robert Moss (Conscious Dreaming, and Growing Big Dreams: Manifesting Your Heart's Desires through Twelve Secrets of the Imagination), and studied Improvisation and Musical Theatre at The Second City, Hollywood.

We met on October 30 at the Topping Room. In keeping with the 2022 One County One Book's theme of "Tastemakers", Emily Tan joined us as our guest speaker. Emily is an owner of SpiceTopia, Foster Library's neighbor at 576 E. Main Street. Spicetopia sells organic, fair trade, and ethically sourced spices and teas, as well as locally crafted foods. Emily gave a fascinating talk on the history of spices, focusing on saffron and Aleppo chili peppers, and answered audience questions.

During the business part of the meeting, we voted to change our Bylaws to add a board position for the Manager of the Friends of the Library Bookstore. The Chair of the Book Sales Committee has always been a board member. This was established long before the Friends had a store that operated 5 or 6 days a week. We agreed that the level of responsibility the book store manager has warrants a board position in addition to the position of the Book Sales Committee chair.







