PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE by Mary Olson

Summer 2023 was the first time since 2019 that the Summer Reading Program offered a full schedule of activities at E.P. Foster, Hill Road, Avenue and Saticoy libraries. The Friends were delighted to fund interactive music programs, wildlife presentations and drawing workshops at all those venues. Funds provided by the Friends have also been used for children and teen events at the library all throughout the year, including providing supplies for storytime, crafternoons, STEAM kits, Young Readers Books and support of the Teen Advisory Group.

We used our new Instagram account to highlight our participation in the Artwallk in September. Our bookstore volunteers literally put the Topping Room on the map -- as a stop on the Artwalk -where we sold donated art works and art books, hosted two artists and took the opportunity to reintroduce Main Street shoppers to our bookstore in E.P Foster and to our online offerings.

In addition to raising funds through the sale of donated books, the Friends may pass some of our bounty along to others. During the Summer Reading Program, gift certficates to the Friends bookstore in E.P. Foster Library are used as prizes for kids accomplishing some of their reading goals. We also have on occasion made available some of our inventory to school librarians in Ventura to add to their schools' collections. And we contributed to the bookdrive project of the Girl Up Club of Foothill Tech High, helping them to reach their goal of sending 1,000 books to Malawi. On October 28, we are providing books to be given away as treats at E.P. Foster Library during Ventura Downtown merchants' Trick-or-Treat!

In November, as part of the celebration of the 150th anniversary of Ventura County, the Friends are sponsoring 2 appearances of Deborah Holt Larkin, author of A Lovely Girl: The Tragedy of Olga Duncan and the Trial of One of California's Most Notorious **Killers.** On November 4, she will appear at City Hall to discuss and sign her book and on November 5, she will be the guest speaker at our Annual Membership Meeting in the Topping Room. As part of this anniversary celebration, Ventura Friends of the Library welcome Deborah Holt Larkin, author of a memoir of true crime and journalism in 1950's Ventura.

Deborah Holt Larkin was ten years old when her father, the court reporter for the Ventura County Star-Free Press, was immersed in the trial of Olga Duncan's killers taking place at the Ventura County Courthouse (now Ventura City Hall). Larkin's memoir tells the story of this stranger-than-fiction murder case, and the influence of her reporter father's work in her early life.

"In between the carefully researched true crime procedural chapters, the thread of the story winds back to chapters of my coming-of-age memoir about our quirky family life and my dawning realization that sometimes terrible things can happen to good girls. That evil can hide behind a mask of normalcy."

Deborah Larkin will also be the guest speaker at our Annnual Membership Meeting on Sunday, November 5, 2:00 to 4:00 pm at the Topping Room at E.P. Foster Library.

Her talk for our meeting will concentrate on her father, Bob Holt. Some of our members will remember his deadline reporting and whimsical columns from his 34 year career with the Ventura Star-Free Press.

This year, our bylaw changes are recommended by the Governing Documents Committee to clarify the meaning of "in good standing", to provide consistency throughout the document and to permit notifications to be made by electronic transmission (as opposed to postal mail only).

Subject: BYLAWS - PROPOSED CHANGE

Please review the proposed change to the Association's Bylaws. Proposed **deletion** is in strikeout.

Proposed addition is in bold underscore italic.

We will vote on the proposed change at our November 5, 2023 General Meeting. The Board of Directors has reviewed and supports the propsed change.

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

Section 2. Eligibility. To be eligible to serve as an officer, a member must be in good standing, <u>having paid dues in a timely fashion and</u> adhering to all governing documents.

Section 4. Duties.

- c. Recording Secretary. The Recording Secretary shall:
- 2) Preserve in a permanent file all official records of the Association, other than financial records.
- e. Treasurer. The Treasurer shall;
- 4) Deliver all books, records, and related papers <u>for the annual review</u> to the Financial Reviewer <u>immediately following his or her</u> <u>appointment</u> by the end of the second month of the fiscal year for annual review.

ARTICLE VII - MEETINGS

Section 1. General Membership.

- a. Regular Meetings.
- 2) Calls to the meetings shall be mailed <u>sent</u> to all members two (2) weeks prior to meetings.
- **c. Special Meetings.** Special general membership meetings may be called by the President, a majority of the Board, or by petition of ten percent (10%) of the members upon one (1) week notice mailed sent to the members stating the purpose of the meeting.

ARTICLE IX - FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY

Section 7. Financial Review. A financial reviewer shall be appointed by the Board, at its first meeting of the new fiscal year meeting in the third month of the fiscal year, to review the Treasurer's records and report to the Board at a subsequent regular meeting, but no later than the sixth meeting of the new fiscal year. Financial review details are documented in the Standing Rules.

ARTICLE XV - AMENDMENTS

Section 2. Member Consideration. These bylaws may be amended or revised at a general membership meeting of this Association by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of those present and voting, provided notice and a copy of the proposal has been mailed <u>sent</u> to all members two (2) weeks prior to the meeting at which the proposal shall be considered.




