PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE by Mary Olson

2023 has been a very active year for Ventura Friends of the Library members reaching out to the greater community to bring awareness of our organization and of the value of libraries.

Book sales were held at the Vons at Telegraph & Victoria in March, July and November.

In March, we participated in the St. Patrick's Day Parade, passing out flyers advertising our March book sale all along the parade route.

In April, our members assisted in greeting and shepherding visitors to the second Rising from the Ashes home tour. This event, a tour of some of the homes beautifully rebuilt after the Thomas Fire, is a fundraiser for the Ventura County Library Foundation. Funding projects of the Ventura County Library Foundation include the Mobile Library and the One County One Book reading program.


Ventura's Art Walk returned in September 2023, after taking a break due to the pandemic. Our volunteers were instrumental in getting E.P. Foster Library Topping Room included as a stop on the walk. During this 2 day event, we sold art works that had been donated to us, as well as books on art and architecture, and were able to introduce community members to our bookstore in E.P. Foster. We shared the space in the Topping Room with 2 local artists exhibiting their work. It was surprising to us how many were unaware that there was a bookstore inside of the library.

In November, we participated in the 150th anniversary of Ventura County, hosting a talk and book signing with local author, Deborah Holt Larkin. Deborah was 10 years old in 1959 when her father, a reporter for the Ventura Star-Free Press covered the scandalous Ma Duncan trial. Her memoir, "A Lovely Girl: The Tragedy of Olga Duncan and the Trial of One of California's Most Notorious Killers" recounts the story of the trial and its enduring influence on the author's life.

The event was held in the atrium of Ventura City Hall. At the time of the trial, what is now City Hall was the Ventura County Courthouse, where the trial took place. Our volunteers provided signage and escorted attendees into the venue, pointing out specific locations referenced in the book. Volunteers provided the audio equipment and oversaw the A/V aspects of the event. Others helped with the refreshment table and assisted the author with the book signing in the outdoor area. More than 100 people attended the event. The Museum of Ventura County provided us with a \$1,000 grant to support our participation in the 150th anniversary. Deborah Holt Larkin was also the guest speaker at our Annual Membership Meeting.

Ventura Friends of the Library Annual Membership Meeting

took place on November 5, 2023. We welcomed guest speaker Deborah Holt Larkin. Her appearance at our Annual Meeting was the second event we sponsored as part of the 150th Anniversary of Ventura County. Her memoir took us back to the Ventura of 1959 and life with her father, Bob Holt, reporter for the Ventura Star-Free Press during the time of the stranger-than-fiction Ma Duncan trial.



She describes her book, "A Lovely Girl: The tragedy of Olga Duncan and the Trial of one California's Most Notorious Killers", as a carefully researched true crime procedural, interspersed with chapters of a coming-of-age memoir about her quirky life in midcentury Ventura. Her talk at our meeting recounted the story of the notorious trial as well as her father's more quotidian reporting and elicited questions and reminiscences from our members who recalled Bob Holt from his 34 year career with the Star-Free Press.

In the business part of the meeting, we voted to approve Bylaw changes to define the meaning of "a member in good standing", clarify language concerning records handled by the Secretary and Treasurer and to permit certain required notifications to members to be made by email as well as by postal mail. The Governing Documents Committee continues to review our bylaws for internal consistency and compatibility with 21st century practices and methods of communication.

Volunteers are needed 6 days a week for sales in our store. A shift in the store is 3 hours. Some volunteers sign up for a monthly shift and some for a weekly shift. Help is also needed during our book sales which occur 3 or 4 times a year. Help is needed setting up the book sales, during the book sales and closing the book sales. Volunteers can participate in this way for as little as 3 hours a month, or a quarter.

We would also like to add to our team for sorting and pricing books which are donated to us and organizing the book sales. Our volunteer crew is aging and we could really use some younger people with strong backs for moving those boxes of books.

The landscape for communications and publicity is constantly evolving, and volunteers with more current experience would be very helpful. An Instagram account was established for 2nd_look_books_ventura. More volunteers adept at posting updates of all our activities would be very welcome!

Of course, the goal of all this activity is to support our public libraries. In 2023, Ventura Friends of the Library were able to fund supplies for the Young Readers Book Club at E.P. Foster, the Teen Advisory Group, supplies for Maker Spaces at E.P. Foster and Hill Road libraries, arts and crafts supplies at Avenue, E.P. Foster and Hill Road, special Summer Reading interactive programs in music and art at Avenue, E.P. Foster, Hill Road and Saticoy libraries and some adult programming at all four branches. In all, we provided more than \$27,000 in funding over the course of the year. Our year end gift to the library was \$35,000. The year end gift is used by the library to add books to the collection for all four branches.

For more information about current happenings at the library, Ventura County Library has a very extensive website at https://vencolibrary.org. You can access the catalog there, event listings and the eLibrary with many online resources available to you through your library card. On almost any page of the website, a rectangular button will appear on the right hand side, labeled "Video Tutorials" which you can click to access a list of available tutorials. If there is someone available to chat with by way of text messages, a speech bubble button labeled "Chat Live Now" will appear in the lower right corner which you can click to start a conversation. Ventura County Library has also initiated a new phone system.

To reach any branch, dial 805 626-READ. The friendly person who answers the phone can assist you with many basic services, including helping you renew a book or place a book on hold, updating your library account, providing operating locations and hours, and more. And if they can't help you directly, they will get you to someone who can in a timely and efficient manner.

You can also keep up with the news by picking up a copy of the Ventura Breeze, Your Hometown Newspaper, and looking for the column **Bookmarks: About Libraries and Friends.**

Thanks to Sheldon Brown, editor of the Breeze, for giving us this opportunity to share the good news about the activities of the Friends and the activities we can all enjoy at the libraries!

E.P. Foster Library also has ukuleles that you can check out for three weeks, renewable up to 3 times, dependent on availability. Call 805 626-READ.




Join the Discover Science team for an exploration of chemical reactions, acids and bases, while creating a melting snowman!
