PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Today, well into the 21st century, the day to day activities of Friends of the Library have changed a lot since our inception in 1969. We all still value libraries as essential infrastructure, are (sometimes excessively) fascinated by books of all kinds and pretty much allergic to waste. And, we are still receiving a constant stream of donated books, CDs and DVDs. In an effort to fulfill our purpose of supporting our libraries, we continue to expand our bookselling activities.

Our bookstore in E.P. Foster Library is now open 7 days a week, Monday through Saturday, 11:00 am to 4:00 pm and Sundays. 1:00 to 4:00 pm. The roster of bookstore volunteers currently numbers about 50 -- and more would be very welcome. Volunteers may work as little as one 2 1/2 hour shift a month or be available to be called on when a substitute is needed.

We continue to hold large book sales, roughly quarterly, usually at the Vons at Telegraph & Victoria. This activity requires some other types of volunteers -- those who have trucks plus more who are capable of heavy lifting. We also sell items on Amazon and eBay. This allows us to find buyers for collectibles, antiquarian and other quirky items that would not be readily sold to casual shoppers and to capture the value of some rare items.

Before books appear in the store or are transported to a sale, they must be received (also requires a bit of heavy lifting) and sorted. These activities take place at E.P. Foster library and at our warehouse in the county maintenance yard in Saticoy. Sorting can be more of an art than a science, including setting some items aside for research for suitability for listing on Amazon or eBay, organizing the rest by genre and pricing for sale.

Our most recent adventure in sales has been a reinvigorated effort in selling on eBay. Manga are quite popular on eBay. Examples of other types of items we have sold are a 1928 edition of Etiquette by Emily Post, topographical maps of the Mojave desert and a Lafayette Radio electronics catalog from 1974. Sales since May have generated over \$4,000 of income. The tasks in this effort have been divided into researching the value of items; listing the items on the platform; monitoring the site, confirming the sale and purchasing postage and passing along the information; and packaging the items and delivering to the post office.


We have discontinued listing books for sale on our Square store. Our online store for local sales was initiated during the pandemic when libraries had closed their doors. Selling books online with customers picking up their purchases outdoors served us well when libraries were allowing patrons to check out books with a similar procedure. Last year, however, customers to our online store dwindled precipitously, so we are now using it only to offer members the convenience of renewing memberships and making donations online. We also use our Square account to be able to accept credit cards for payment at our periodic outdoor sales.

One County One Book 2024

One County One Book is a program of Ventura County Library which aims to engage the community around a common narrative. This year's community reading selection is:

Rough Sleepers: Dr. Jim O'Connell's Urgent Mission to Bring Healing to Homeless People by Tracy Kidder.



From the publisher's description of Rough Sleepers, "Kidder tells the story of Dr. Jim O'Connell, a gifted man who invented a community of care for a city's unhoused population, including those who sleep on the streets—the 'rough sleepers.'

After Jim O'Connell graduated from Harvard Medical School and was nearing the end of his residency at Massachusetts General, the hospital's chief of medicine made a proposal:

Would he defer a prestigious fellowship and spend a year helping to create an organization to bring health care to homeless citizens? That year turned into O'Connell's life's calling. Tracy Kidder spent five years following Dr. O'Connell and his colleagues as they work with thousands of homeless patients, some of whom we meet in this illuminating book."

All three now retired, they decided they should take a trip together and each sister chose a country to plan for the week of their travel. Navigating family dynamics is not always easy, and close quarters every day with the stress of travelling can be challenging. This memoir explores the past and present family connections and how that influences their relationship on the trip and afterwards.

About the Author

Elizabeth "Liz" Moore Kraus has lived in Ventura County for over 30 years with her spouse, Dave, and son Brent-Stig. At the age of 42, Liz enrolled in college to earn her M.A. in English Literature from CSU Northridge. She taught at Saint Bonaventure High School from 2000-2014, and then at Ventura College until 2019 when she retired. It was shortly thereafter she embarked on the 3 week trip with her sisters. She is working on two more books and is back teaching at VC.



The Summer Reading Program: Read, Renew, Repeat encouraged readers of all ages to join. Registration and recording of reading activity was offered online. Adult participants were also offered the option of old-school reporting on paper forms.

E.P. Foster and Hill Road libraries also offered on site book clubs where students could meet to discuss books. This year's theme was appreciation of nature and conservation. The Friends funded programs at E.P. Foster, Hill Road, Avenue and Saticoy on Science Heroes, Ventura Bee Rescue, Children's literature based Magic shows and musical puppet shows.

Summer reading attendance at E.P. Foster has grown every year since the library reopened after the pandemic. The Friends provided coupons to be used as prizes, redeemable for books from the Friends' bookstore and held a mini children's book sale at the end of summer party at E.P. Foster.

Over 380 kids registered for Summer Reading at Hill Road Library and many enthusiastic readers came in to pick up their prizes including books, reusable water bottles, stickers, and free pizza coupons provided by Pizza Man Dan's. Avenue Library participated in Lunch at the Library, a program of the California State Library offering free lunch for children, along with presentations on planting, composting and the science of food.



E.P. Foster's Teen Advisory Group was very active this summer assisting with the Summer Reading Program. For the Fall, they are hosting the annual

Ventura County Library now has a second mobile library in the growing library fleet.



This new School Mobile Library will serve schools through a partnership with the Ventura County Office of Education, offering a full range of library services to students, particularly those in the underserved areas of Ventura County and where schools do not have credentialed librarians on staff. The School Mobile Library will offer books for students in multiple formats and languages, STEAM instruction and programs, homework support in alignment with current school curriculum and instruction, and access to technology and online resources.

Funding for the School Mobile Library was provided by the Ventura County Library Foundation, Premier America Credit Union, CBC Federal Credit Union, County Schools Federal Credit Union, and Ventura County Credit Union in addition to a \$250,000 Stronger Together: Improving Library Access Grant received by the library through the California State Library.


