PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Much news from 2024 concerns work in progress. Our reinvigorated effort in selling on eBay has proven to be quite successful. Since February, we have netted over \$10,000! One thing we had not anticipated is the increase in activity over the holiday season, which put a bit of a strain on our volunteers. The tasks involved are divided into selecting items from our donations to be listed (this involves some research), listing items and responding to orders on the eBay site, and packing and delivering to the post office. More volunteers would be welcome.

In 2024, we were able to donate to the library \$6800 for programming at E.P. Foster, Hill Road, Avenue and Saticov libraries at the beginning of the year, \$8,000 for the Summer Reading Program and \$12,900 for programming at the four branches for the rest of 2024. We also contributed \$1,000 in support of the One County One Book program and \$2,000 for collections at E.P. Foster Library which included a grant from Patagonia designated for E.P. Foster

In 2021, we had received a grant from Aera Energy for Brainfuse, an online tutoring program. Subsequently, the California State Library funded this program, but discontinued funding in 2024. We were able to disburse those grant funds so that the library could continue to offer the Brainfuse program this past year. Our end of the year donation to Ventura County Library amounted to \$43,000. which includes income generated from endowment funds held at Ventura County Community Foundation. Our end of year donation is used to add books to the collections at all four branches

In 2023, the library received an \$8.7 million Building Forward Grant from the California State Library for improvements to E.P. Foster Library. Congressman Salud Carbajal secured \$750,000 through Community Project Funding to help fund a heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) system. The grant from the California State Library required a 50 percent match, and last year (2024) the City of Ventura and Ventura County appropriated funds to support this project. During 2024, some upgrades to the wiring in E.P. Foster were made in preparation for the renovation and consultation with structural engineers and architects resulted in a preliminary plan. Contstruction is not scheduled to begin until early 2026 -- still a year away.



Meet Tyler Mayser

Senior City Librarian for the Ventura Region of the Ventura County Library System

Prior to relocating to California, Tyler spent nearly two decades working in public libraries in Charlotte, North Carolina, where she

developed a deep passion for delivering exceptional customer service and ensuring library services meet evolving needs. Now, as Senior City Librarian for Ventura, Tyler is eager to collaborate with library staff, the community, and local partners to continue building a library system that meets the diverse needs of the region.

Tyler received her bachelor's degree in Sociology from Favetteville State University and her master's degree in library and information science at Old Dominion University. Throughout her career, Tyler has gained extensive experience in various library roles. As a Children's Specialist, she redesigned programming to better align with developmental milestones and launched a teen volunteer program. In her role as Circulation Supervisor, Tyler worked with leadership to transition the Charlotte Mecklenburg Library to a fine-free model. During the COVID-19 pandemic, Tyler served as the leader of the library's Safety Team. She led efforts to ensure a safe reopening, managed staff training on safety protocols, and conducted research to guide the library's response. As interim Assistant Director of Collections and Access, she founded the Floating Collection Specialist Team to streamline inventory management across a 21-branch system.

In the early stages of her management career, Tyler initiated the library's first digital literacy program for adults, DigiLit. Later, as Project Manager, she managed a \$3 million budget to revamp DigiLit, including a rebrand, curriculum update, staff training overhaul, and the addition of a Mobile Internet Lab. Tyler was honored to be selected for the Advisory Board of the School of Library and Information Science at her alma mater, Old Dominion University. She has also served as Board President for Peaceful Places, Inc., an organization dedicated to supporting young single mothers facing homelessness due to pregnancy or domestic violence. She is also a member of the California Library Association and the American Evaluation Association.

Outside of her professional and volunteer commitments, Tyler enjoys reading, baking, and spending quality time with her husband, Gustavo, and their beloved dog, Nico.

Ventura Friends of the Library Annual Membership Meeting

was held on Sunday, October 20, 2024 in the E.P. Foster Library Topping Room. Our meeting began with another lively guest speaker. Elizabeth Moore Kraus, a local resident and Creative Writing instructor at Ventura College, discussed her memoir of growing up and traveling as an adult with her sisters: *3 Sisters*, *3 Countries*, *3 Weeks (Still Talking)*.

The talk was followed by a brief business meeting where we elected the Officers of the Board of Directors for 2025 and approved a bylaw change.

We voted to approve a Bylaw change in ARTICLE IX – FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY Section 2. Checks. b. Checks over \$200 shall require two (2) signatures. We voted to change this to raise the amount requiring two signatures to \$500.




The Ukulele Jam

Each week toddlers and pre-schoolers have the opportunity to explore and experiment with sensory play, process art, and constructive play.




