

President's Message by Mary Olson

It's that time again – time for the Summer Reading Program. Support of The Summer Reading Program has always been a priority for the Friends of the Library. As lifelong readers ourselves, we recognize that students who read recreationally outperform those who don't and Students read more when they can choose materials based on their own interests. We are very happy to provide funding for special events during the summer, materials for summer activities and to provide books that are used for rewards for reaching reading goals. See pages 3 & 4 for the summer reading event schedules.

Avenue Library will also again be participating in the "Lunch at the Library" program Monday through Thursday, July 7-31. Lunch at the Library is a project of the California State Library, supported with funds from the State of California providing free lunches for children and teens 18 years and under when they visit the library.

The way we raise funds to support the libraries becomes more complicated every year as the way people shop changes. As we have traditionally been a largely cash based seller, we face challenges as other ways to pay become more prevalent. We are selling books online on Amazon and eBay which has provided a way to sell books, some of high value, for which we would not even be able to find a local buyer. We had our best month ever in March with eBay – netted \$2,030.09. This happy result does require a lot of volunteer time, along with constant vigilance, as eBay has strict requirements for timeliness of response to inquiries and sales through their site.

We face challenges at the other end of the value scale as Discover Books has gone out of business. Discover Books used to buy books from us, priced by the pound, some of which they would sell online. They would accept all our surplus, including books which would end up as recyclables or trash. We are actively looking for an alternative. However, most options we are looking at are more selective and require scanning and boxing which involves much more volunteer time. Which all means that we are always seeking more volunteers for a great variety of tasks, from sorting donations and researching items we receive to in person selling in our store and at periodic sales to packing and mailing books on their way to online buyers. 

Vine Time: Growing Magnificent Melons & Cucumbers




PAWS for Reading


