CITY COUNCIL ADOPTS RECOMMENDATIONS TO IMPROVE VENTURA'S LIBRARIES

On Monday, November 14, after three hours of deliberation, Ventura City Council voted 5-2 to adopt the reccommendations made by the city's Library Advisory Commission and Library Strategic Plan Steering Committee.

Over the past six months, the 20 members of the Library Strategic Plan Steering Committee, under the leadership of Chair Jim Friedman and Vice Chair Debbie Giles, represented a wide swath of the residents and business owners of our City and brought to the process the wishes of those they represented. In addition, Committee members listened to public comments and the findings of the Consultant who was hired to direct the Strategic Planning process, carefully considering the suggestions and findings of each in order to develop a plan for the future of Ventura's libraries. The recommendations, a result of the hard work put in by Steering Committee members, do not meet everyone's desires of what Ventura's libraries should look like. However, they are doable within the City's current Library Budget.

The resulting recommendations, unanimously adopted by both the Library Plan Steering Committee and the Library Advisory Commission at a joint meeting held on October 12, together with two additional recommendations from the Library Advisory Commission meeting on October 25, were presented to City Council on Monday, November 14. I sat at the presentation table with City Staff members, Strategic Plan Consultant MaryEllin Santiago, and County Librarian Jackie Griffin while presentations were made, discussions held, questions answered and public comments heard. The vast majority of comments were in favor of remaining with the County Library System and encouraging the establishment of a library presence east of Victoria Avenue in the very near future.

We have two viable libraries in Ventura, which, at this time, can be supported without new taxes. One of the recommendations Council adopted is to start now in exploring what the East end library might look like and cost, what can be done until a permanent library is established, and how will both be funded. As Kathy Thomson, President of SBFOL, said

Monday night, "A library is not a building housing books but rather the services provided therein and the knowledgeable and caring staff who help to deliver those services. The package isn't as important as what is offered inside."

City Council also adopted a proposal to form a committee consising of representatives from City Council, City staff, Strategic Plan Steering Committee and Library Advisory Commission to work with the County Library System to implement the adopted recommendations. The committee will report to the Council in April 2012.

The Library Strategic Plan will be completed by the Consultant by April 2012 as well. I will keep you posted on future developments. In the meantime, I urge you to become a knowledgeable participant in the future of our libraries. Study the documents that have come out of the Library Strategic Planning Process. 

Volunteer Spotlight Chuck Carlson: Our Man for All Seasons

The San Buenventura Friends of the Library receives thousands of donated books each year. These books are destined either for the library shelves or to be sold in the Friends' bookstore or at periodic sales events. The sales are the lifeblood of the Friends. You've probably met Chuck Carlson at one of our sales. He is the one wearing the white oxford shirt emblazoned with famous authors' names.

As far back as anyone can remember, Chuck has been the impresario of the book sales, even while serving as president of the Friends for a time. His management expertise, creativity and mental and physical energy ensure that the book sales build both public awareness and funding for the libraries. For weeks prior to the sale, he develops the themes, creates posters, engineers display hardware, coordinates volunteers and searches for saleable books at the warehouse, making each sale a class act -- all on a "volunteer's salary". After each sale, he catalogues his photos to create a historical account of the other volunteers' efforts and creates a statistical analysis of the sale. He always speaks glowingly of the many student and adult volunteers and concludes each event with a flurry of thank you letters and emails.

Chuck's ingenuity and initiative have been the driving force behind the Friends, never more so than when he was a constant presence of Wright Library. At Wright, he managed a "Weekly Featured Author Section", recruited volunteers and sorted all the donated books to find those worthy of the library's shelves. Head Librarian Mary Lynch remembers: "We added thousands of dollars worth of books to Wright Library's collection because Chuck was willing to add (an) extra step ... When Chuck found out that the students at Foothill had to perform a certain number of volunteer hours a year he was on that so fast -- over to the





school, talk to the principal, any Foothill student who came into the library was informed of the joys of helping with the book sales".

When Wright Library was threatened with closure, Chuck launched a heroic effort. He rallied his crew and doubled book sale efforts in order to raise funds to help cover the library budget shortfall.

Chuck's big heart for people, and, of course, books, has brought great benefit to Ventura's libraries. At the next book sale event, be sure to look for Chuck in his perpetual uniform, the white oxford shirt with authors' names on it.


