IN MEMORIAM

William Eugene "Gene" Simmons, a former Treasurer for San Buenaventura Friends of the Library, passed away in December. Gene served in the Army Air Corps during World War II, earning the Distinguished Flying Cross. He graduated with Honors from UC Berkeley with a B.S. in Mechanical Engineering and went on to a thirty year career with Shell Oil as a wellrespected petroleum engineer. He and and his wife, Esther, were accomplished competitive bridge players. Gene was an avid reader and a crossword enthusiast. One of his many contributions to SBFOL is his documentation of "DUTIES OF THE TREASURER" as a guide to those who followed him in that office. He also worked in the warehouse, specializing in children's books. His volunteer work extended beyond SBFOL to include tutoring children in reading, Food Share, and helping senior citizens with their income tax. He was a truly gentle man with a wonderful sense of humor. It is with appreciation that we acknowledge Gene's contribution to Ventura, and to SBFOL, in particular.


