PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE by Kathy Thomson

This past spring, the city of Ventura, the Library Advisory Commission and the Friends of the Library delved into city history to ascertain the original color of E. P. Foster Library in preparation for painting. This research unearthed some interesting archival history of the San Buenaventura Friends of the Library.

Did you know that Friends of the Library groups have been around since Ben Franklin's time? Citizen groups would gather and distribute books to other citizen groups. It is great to see that this long held tradition is alive and well in Ventura.

In 1970, their first full year, the SBFOL had 82 members and raised \$577 for libraries. Today we have almost 300 members and approximately 75 regular volunteers. Through March 31st, book sales brought in \$53,000, plus donations, dues, memorials and tributes, all contributing to meeting current and future library needs within the city.

We invite you to be a part of history in celebrating and preserving libraries. If you want to help us in any way as we 'redistribute books to other citizen groups' or if you recognize an area where we are ineffective, please contact me at 658-2248. Let me know if you would like to assist with a short term, seasonal, intermittent or special project. We have a place for everyone and every skill level.

And the result of the research into the historical color of E.P. Foster library? The City Council unanimously passed the color palette recommended by the Library Advisory Commission - parchment on the building with historical green as trim. Berta Steele will be working with Jack Schafer, Chair of the Historical Preservation Committee on finalizing the color scheme. Denise Sindelar from the City Staff is working on the specifications for the paint which will then be forwarded to the County who will be responsible for painting the building.

Mary has also been a strong advocate for patrons, served on the CAPS Board networking with community leaders, and attended and spoke at many public meeting on behalf of our libraries.

SBFOL extends our best wishes to Mary in her retirement. She will be dearly missed.


MEMBERSHIP NEWS

it's pretty easy being green!

Have you ever heard the term "upcycling"? It refers to old products being given MORE value, not less. If what the Friends do with the donations they receive is not exactly upcycling, it is certainly putting those donations to their best and highest

The first option for a donated book is to be added to the library's collection. Small paperback books, like the Babysitter Club series, which are popular with teens and tweens will make their way to the library's shelves to replace tattered copies and be read many more times.

New technology allows us to pick through the donations for collectibles and books which can bring a higher price if offered to a wider audience. Volunteer Teddy Wood has a good eye for identifying books to scan electronically, using the ISBN. She can then check to see if those books are being offered through Amazon.com, the number of copies being offered and the price. San Buenaventura Friends of the Library now has a presence on Amazon. Teddy has sold collectibles and art and text books through Amazon for a much greater yield than would have been realized at a local sale.

The greatest volume of sales is still through the bookstore at E.P. Foster Library and the periodic book sales. When you shop there, you can congratulate yourself on getting a great bargain as well as being green and supporting your local libraries. The money raised purchases library materials and equipment and funds the summer reading program and year-round programs for children and youth. Donated paperback books are also "regifted" to the county jail. One generous patron also buys inexpensive children's books to leave at laundramats so that children there have something valuable to do with their time.

So you can see that when you donate books or buy books from the Friends of the Library, you make it easy for us to be green!

WHEN YOU DONATE: SOME GUIDELINES

Are the books clean and in good condition?

If they are hardbound fiction, how old? We do not sell many of these older books.

Does the donor believe that the books are sales-worthy?

Classics are always accepted and sell well, nearly regardless of the wear (within reason).

War, history, travel, western, and biographies sell well also. Please, no magazines, encyclopedias, heavy bibles or dictionaries.

Any donation with any of the above condition problems might better be taken to thrift stores or another non-profit.

Library Strategic Plan Progress

At its May 7 meeting, the City Council accepted the proposed Library Strategic Plan on a 5 - 2 vote, with Jim Monahan and Neal Andrews voting against. Mr. Andrews would like to opt out of the County Library System and have the City run its own library system. At the suggestion of several Council members, evaluation criteria and methods of measuring outcomes will become a part of the implementation of the Strategic Plan. There was much interest in an East Ventura library presence and that will be a priority for the working group which will be appointed to implement the Plan. The County Library System is very cooperative and has already implemented or is in the process of implementing recommendations in the Plan.

The County Library Foundation is exploring funding sources for a Bookmobile which could be in operation before the end of the year. This is a stop-gap measure for East Ventura, but, at the least, there will be some library presence until a more permanent location can be established. Any permanent location will mean identifying sources of funding outside the City budget. This will be the focus of future community outreach efforts.

Read and Ride at the Fair

Students (K-8th grade) can read books in exchange for carnival ride passes. For every two books the student reads (and writes a brief summary), they receive 3 carnival ride passes from the Ventura County Fair. The submission form is available at www.venturacountyfair.org (Click on the picture of the Ferris wheel). The form must be turned in by July 15.





