

## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE by Kathy Thomson

It has been 50 years since the glory days of library building in Ventura. The front building of E.P. Foster Library was added in 1959, Avenue Library opened at a new location and expanded hours in 1964 and H. P. Wright Memorial Library was built in 1965. Ventura's population had grown from 29,114 in 1960 to 57,964 in 1970. San Buenaventura Friends of the Library was founded in 1969 "to promote and share the wealth of information and opportunities the public library has to offer".

A lot has changed in Ventura since our most recent library was built. Population has grown to 108,961 as of January, 2014. Many aspects of library service have changed, but much has remained the same. Patrons still reserve and pick up books, browse the shelves, bring children to story time and Summer Reading Program and ask questions of the helpful and well trained staff. But now, computers are in high demand and used regularly, e-books, music and videos are downloaded from the library system, Kindle e-readers can be borrowed from the library, and most reference materials can be accessed on line. A lot has changed, but what remains is that citizens of all ages need and use a library.

It is quite clear that the huge population growth from 1960 to 2014 has occurred east of Ventura College yet the library that was built to service that population is no longer available. It is imperative that the Friends and our supporters continue to work toward restoring and growing library services to meet the needs of Ventura's citizens. Since the closing of Wright Library, the Friends have been consistently working with the City of Ventura, Ventura Library Advisory Commission, Ventura County Library System and our representative on the Board of Supervisors, Steve Bennett, to bring library service to Ventura's huge population center on the East End. Most recently, our newly elected Vice President, Marianne Coffey, and I have met with Supvr. Bennett to look for unused or underutilized county property east of Victoria Ave. to begin that establishment of an east side library presence. We are hoping our cooperative efforts between the county and city will ultimately solve the problem of lack of library services on the east end.

We have a great opportunity to plan for Ventura's future library location, theme and service model. Your attention to this continued effort is greatly appreciated. Your contributions, attention to Library Advisory Commission and City Council library issues, and invitation to your friends and neighbors to support libraries through a Friends membership are important ways that you can help.

Just a reminder, a portion of funds raised each year goes to the Friends' Capital Improvement Fund while the rest goes toward library collection materials, equipment and programs. Many still are not aware that without the generous support of the contributors to FOL, programs and new materials at our libraries would be nonexistent.

#### So much going on at Avenue Library!

Avenue Library is building relationships with community members of all ages.

On April 30, the library hosted the annual El día de los niños/El día de los libros (Children's Day/Book Day) celebration of literacy for children of all linguistic and cultural backgrounds. The live mariachi music, crafting workshop, and an early literacy story telling filled the stacks of Avenue Library to the brim.







Avenue Library recently renovated the children's area to make room for more early literacy classes and craft workshops.

Students from Sheridan Way Elementary, Blanche Reynolds Elementary, EP Foster Elementary, Will Rogers Elementary, De Anza Middle School, Cabrillo Middle School and Ventura High School all have sought Homework assistance at the library. Library staff member Sheila Popnoe reflected on how the homework center provides an intergenerational space for the community to come together and help each other: "Often when I have many students at one time, the older ones will help the younger ones with their homework. . . Mothers sometimes come in with their children, and provide help to their children and others as well."

Avenue Library also reaches out to local schools with comprehensive library tours.

The Spring Craft Party, originally intended for just two sessions, was extended an extra day due to popular demand.

Laubach Literacy holds ESL classes at Avenue Library. Recently, Laubach Literacy has begun offering one on one ESL tutoring which has caused a sharp increase in the number of students attending.

In the middle of March, a water leak in one of the apartments above Avenue Library caused a temporary closure for two weeks. Despite the main building being closed to the public, the popular ESL classes and Homework center continued in the library's multipurpose room and in the spaces generously provided by the Ventura Avenue Adult Center and the City of Ventura.

Avenue Library has began a volunteer partnership with Arc of Ventura County. The Arc of Ventura County is a non-profit providing opportunities for adults with developmental disabilities. Several Arc participants helped with packet assembly and light book cleaning after updating their library cards and picking up a few fun films and books. Avenue Library will continue to seek out volunteer partnerships with the local community.

The Teen Advisory Group meets twice monthly at Avenue Library. There has been an upsurge in interest by local teens in volunteering as the school year nears completion and their community service hours are due. The Teen Advisory Group will be very involved in nearly every event planned for Summer Reading 2015.

At our annual meeting in March, we Friends of the Library voted in some changes to update our organization. We have changed our fiscal year to conform to the calendar year — our fiscal year will now begin on January 1 and end on December 31 (a change from beginning on April 1 and ending on March 31). Our annual meeting will now be held in October, rather than March. We voted to "do business as" "Ventura Friends of the Library". We have received comments that "SBFOL" is sometimes interpreted as "Santa Barbara Friends of the Library". So, in future, we will refer to ourselves as Ventura Friends of the Library (VFOL) — we're now working on filing the paperwork and updating our logo and correspondence materials.

Meanwhile, back at our bookstore -- Thanks to all of our wonderful, dedicated volunteers and faithful donors we have an abundance of books, DVDs, and audio books to sell. Our bookstore manager, Colleen Gallo, and Teddy Wood, who manages our storefront on Amazon.com, were honored by RSVP (Retired Senior Volunteer Program) of Ventura County for each surpassing **4,000 hours** of volunteering!

The bookstore has been updated with some repurposed shelving from library surplus. We have also ordered some additional taller shelving to display and sell more books. And, we have installed a new desk, reportedly giving our volunteers a bit more room to maneuver. So stop by to browse and enjoy our bookstore renovations -- or volunteer and try out our new desk!



#### AND, CELEBRATING THE PAST



Ventura will celebrate its 150th Anniversary on April 2, 2016. Plans are well underway for a citywide celebration and the Friends of the Library have been invited to participate.

We will be working with our new children's librarian on historical story times, poster and art contests for children; and "Find Ventura," and geocaching activities for teens.

In the months leading up to the anniversary we will also be contributing to a Facebook feed of the last 150 years of Ventura history. So we will need all of you to dig out historical treasures to contribute: library history through the years, early stories from the founding of the Friends, vignettes of families, early businesses, photos of old houses and places then and now, Earl Stanley Gardner and other tales.

I am going to be contributing an early murder mystery from the archives of the County Museum.


