


Drought Effects



The Arc of Ventura County provides opportunities for adults with special needs. Pooling the shared collection of Ventura County Libraries, staff at Avenue Library has been working with Arc to provide materials for their book club. A large number of the participants at Arc also volunteer at libraries on a regular basis. Avenue Library continued the partnership with Arc of Ventura County offering a book club for adults with special needs. So far, the Arc Book Club has read The Island of the Blue Dolphins, Hatchet, and The Secret Garden. The value of Ventura Libraries being part of the Ventura County Library System is the ability to pool collections and offer such a deep collection to support community activities.


