

# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE by Mary Olson

There's something about big round numbers that put us in a contemplative mood, whether it's a personal birthday, anniversary or a milestone of some public event. In the year 2019, our Friends of the Library organization turns 50 years old. This has led the board to search out the scrapbooks kept by early members of San Buenaventura Friends of the Library. We can't determine a precise date for our birthday as an organization -- there are newspaper clippings from several organizating events. Ventura was a smaller town in 1969 and newspapers reported more local events. The goals of this new organization were clearly stated in one article: "The new group will concentrate on bringing library service to people not now reached by the library -- the elderly and disenfranchised, residents of the county Juvenile Hall, patients in convalescent homes and hospitals -- and help in various ways with the services of the city and county library system."

Today, we are still devoted to the goal of extending the reach of library service. Even in this 21st century, Professor of Sociology Eric Klinenberg, in his book "Palaces for the People", has observed that libraries and their social infrastructure are essential not only for a neighborhood's vitality but also for buffering all kinds of personal problems – including isolation and loneliness.



We also show up at City Council meetings, Community Council meetings and other public forums to increae awareness of and advocate for the support of our public libraries.



**Ventura Friends of the Library Annual Membership Meeting** 

took place on October 21 at Hill Road Library. Librarian Molly Krill described for us the innovative features of Hill Road Library, including the availability of Open+ morning "Express Hours". This system allows library customers to access materials and resources outside of standard operating hours. Access to the express hours requires a current library account in good standing, as well as special registration at the Hill Road Library during staffed hours.

Hill Road Library is the first library on the west coast to adopt this system. This has garnered Hill Road Library a starring role in a Bibliotheca (creator of the Open+technology) promotional video as well as an award for innovation for Ventura County Library from The California County Information Services Directors Association (CCISDA).

Some of our members present at the meeting immediately signed up for Open+ access.

During the business part of the meeting, we voted to change our Bylaws to allow the board to appoint individuals to be included on the bank signature card in addition to the President, Vice President, Recording Secretary and Treasurer.

### **Treasurer's Update**

The Friends volunteers, members and contributors were able to raise funds to provide close to \$54,000 for Ventura's four libraries in calendar year 2018. These funds were used to support the Summer Reading Program and other youth related activities plus provide a year end gift for collection needs at each library. At print time the final numbers are still being tabulated but \$54,000 will be close to the final year end amount. In addition, \$4425 was deposited in the Friends Capital Improvement fund with VCCF, per standing rule requirements.



# Among Friends....

That header has been scanned from an early newsletter of the Friends of the Library.

We are fortunate that Friends who came before us have preserved early newsletters, newspaper clippings and other mementoes in scrapbooks.

In the oldest of those scrapbooks, there is a newspaper clipping which reads:

"A new book and a new organization will be launched at an open house marking the start of National Library Week tomorrow at 5 p.m. in the E.P. Foster Library, 651 E. Main St., Ventura. The new book is Charles Outland's "Mines, Murders and Grizzlies" and the new organization is Friends of the Library, a group which will have as its primary aim the support of library activities in the community."


A handwritten notation reads: "April 1969".

One of the mementos in that scrapbook is pictured here, a telegram congratulating Mrs. Virginia Dunkle, the Organizing Chairman of San Buenaventura Friends of the Library on the early activities of the organization. The telegram is from the Assistant Secretary for Community and Field Services of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, Washington, DC.

This year our Friends of the Library group reaches the milestone of our 50th year of holding book sales and supporting library activities.



A celebration is certainly in order, so a Ventura Friends of the Library 50th Anniversary Committee has been established. As our town has grown over the years, realizing our goal of extending the reach of library service has brought four branches of the Ventura County Library into our area of support. It seems fitting to sponsor four individual celebrations, one at each branch.

Our first event will be held at Avenue Library on Saturday, March 2. Children's bi-lingual author Amada Perez will be our guest. (Another newspaper clipping in that scrapbook notes that "Funds received for memberships and through money-making activities will be spent for expanding the library's usefulness by purchasing quantities of simply written paperback books in English and Spanish to serve adults and juveniles with limited reading abilities, or those who speak little or no English")

We are planning to have an event at E.P. Foster Library in conjunction with the Summer Reading Program, to be followed by an event in late August or September at Saticoy Library. We'll wrap up our year of celebration at Hill Road Library in October.

Join us in our celebrations and help us continue our work by your membership in this, our semicentennial year!


