50 years ago --


it was the summer of the moon shot, and, while our newly organized Friends of the Library were no doubt caught up in the general excitement, I'm sure they had no idea of how the technology developed in that effort would transform library service. In the 50 years since the moon landing, the nascent technologies of integrated circuits, digital image sensors and software designed to manage a complex series of systems onboard the capsules have evolved to create today's world. Now, the library with its elibrary offers a portal to a vast reservoir of information, well beyond that contained in the books on the shelves. And, with wifi, laptops, instruction in computer use and STEAM activities, it is a place to acquire the skills to navigate this transformed world. In May, the new Mobile Library was launched (see page 7). It is packed as efficiently as a space capsule to deliver all the benefits of the library to remote locations.

The library also remains a place to experience with others the "A" in "STEAM" -- the arts -- of the spoken word, the written word, delights to see and to hear. You can find a bit of everything in the Summer Reading Program activities.

The celebrations of our anniversary continue with another author visit, musical exploration and book give-away on July 18 at E.P. Foster Library Topping Room, followed by a taste of high-tech ice cream (frozen by liquid nitrogen) at Sub Zero ice cream, next door to the Topping Room.

Our 50th anniversary celebration at Saticoy Library on August 10 will reflect a more whimsical aspect of 1969 with a visit from Ivor Davis, author of "Ladies and Gentlemen . . . The Penguins", a fanciful fable about a famous Penguin rock group from the remote British Falkland Islands in the South Atlantic, who grew up to become one of the most successful pop groups in the world. Even bigger—well almost—than the Beatles. He will be accompanied by the songwriter/singer who is doing the score for a cartoon version of his book. He is generously donating 50 copies of his book in honor of our 50th.
