

The Second Annual One County, One Book features Susan Orlean's *The Library Book*. This title chronicles the 1986 Los Angeles Public Library fire and its aftermath to showcase the larger, crucial role libraries play in our lives. Orlean delves into the evolution of libraries across the country and around the world, from their humble beginnings as a metropolitan charitable initiative to their current status as a cornerstone of national identity. The Washington Post calls The Library Book "a dazzling love letter to a beloved institution."

The 2019 One County, One Book program is made possible through a primary sponsorship from California State University Channel Islands (CSUCI), and additional sponsorships from other organizations including California Lutheran University, the Museum of Ventura County, the Camarillo Public Library, the Calabasas Library, the Ventura County Library Foundation, the Ventura Friends of the Library, and the Ojai Valley Library Friends & Foundation.
